
INSTALLATION

PLEASE READ ENTIRE INSTRUCTIONS BEFORE PROCEEDING

Calculation before Installation

To calculate installation, please refer to TABLE 1. (All calculation in inches.)



ASAFETY WARNING

HOOD MAY HAVE VERY SHARP EDGES; PLEASE WEAR PROTECTIVE GLOVES IF REMOVING ANY PARTS FOR INSTALLING, CLEANING OR SERVICING.

NOTE: BE CAREFUL WHEN USING ELECTRICAL SCREWDRIVER, DAMAGE TO THE HOOD MAY OCCUR.

Preparation before Installation

NOTE: TO AVOID DAMAGE TO YOUR HOOD, PREVENT DEBRIS FROM ENTERING THE VENT OPENING.

- Decide the location of the venting pipe from the hood to the outside. (Figure 1)
- A straight, short venting run will allow the hood to perform more efficiently.
- Try to avoid as many transitions, elbows, and long run as possible. This may reduce the performance of the hood.
- Temporarily wire the hood to test for proper operation before installing.
- Important: Peel any protective film off the hood.
- Use duct tape to seal the joints between pipe sections.
- If necessary, prepare back wall frame with cross framing lumber for secure installation. Refer to Table 1 and measurements on Page 11 to decide the level of the lumber. (Figure 2)
- Optional step for adjusting hood-mounting bracket height:
 - Loosen hood-mounting brackets at the back of the hood, adjust brackets and tighten screws as shown in Figure 3.
- If necessary, remove the rubber stand on the back of the hood and discard.

Hood Installatiom

CAUTION: USE HAND TOOLS ONLY. DO NOT OVER TIGHTEN SCREWS. IT MAY CAUSE DAMAGE TO THE HOOD.

ACAUTION: If moving the cooking range is necessary to install the hood, turn off the power in an electric range at the main electrical box. SHUT OFF THE GAS BEFORE MOVING A GAS RANGE. And use a protective covering to protect cooktop and/or countertop from damage.

- Using references in Table 1 and measurements on Page 11, mark the leveling locations point for hood-mounting bracket on the wall.
- Secure two mounting screws (provided) to the wall, leaving an 1/8" space from the wall. (Figure 4)
- 3. Align the hood-mounting bracket to the mounting screws on the wall and hang hood into place.








4. Secure and tighten the mounting screws.

CAUTION: MAKE SURE THE HOOD IS SECURE BEFORE RELEASING.

Ductwork Installation

- 5. Using Reference **E** from Table 1 and measurements on Page 12, mark the leveling point for duct cover-mounting bracket.
- Secure the duct cover-mounting bracket to the wall with two screws (provided). (Figure 5 and Figure 8) Make sure all screws are tightened. NOTE: Inner duct cover will cover the duct cover-mounting bracket.
- 7. Use 6" steel pipe (not provided) to connect the plastic exhaust on the hood to the ductwork above. Use duct tape to ensure all joints are secure and air tight as shown in Figure 6.

Wiring to Power Supply

THIS RANGE HOOD MUST BE PROPERLY GROUNDED. MAKE SURE THIS IS DONE BY QUALIFIED ELECTRICIAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH ALL APPLICABLE NATIONAL AND LOCAL ELECTRICAL CODES. BEFORE CONNECTING WIRES, SWITCH POWER OFF AT SERVICE PANEL AND LOCK SERVICE PANEL TO PREVENT POWER FROM BEING SWITCHED ON ACCIDENTALLY.

- 8. Connect three wires (black, white and green) to house wires and cap with wire connectors. Connect according to color: black to black, white to white, and green to green.
- Test the operation of the hood before performing the next step. Make sure power is supplied to the hood.

Duct Cover Installation

- 10. Slide inner duct cover up 2 inches before sliding entire duct cover onto the hood. (Figure 7)
- 11. Align the inner duct cover to the duct covermounting bracket. Secure inner duct cover with two (3/16" x 3/8") screws (provided).
- 12. Fasten outer duct cover to plastic plate on the hood with four (3/16" x 3/8") screws (provided).

Install / Uninstall Accessories

13. Place baffle filters underneath the hood.

Final Assembly

- 14. Turn power ON in control panel. Check all lights and fan operation.
- 15. Leave this Installation Instructions and Operation Manual for the homeowner.




